Owls

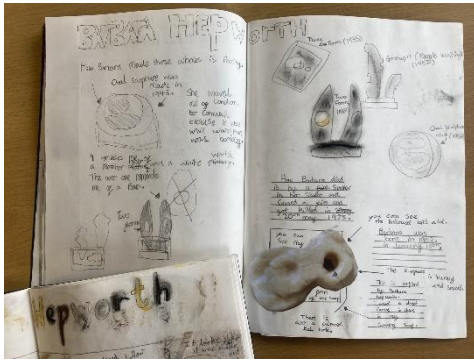
As part of PSHE this week Owls read the story 'Once There Were Giants' then talked about what they would like to be when they grow up. They have some fantastic ideas!

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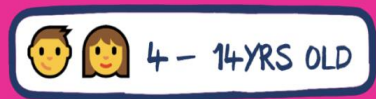
